The Amazing Properties of Nine

– how to help your child remember the nine times table easily

Look at the first ten rows of the 9 times table below:

1	×	9	=	9 (same as 09)
2	×	9	=	18
3	×	9	=	27
4	×	9	=	36
5	×	9	=	45
6	×	9	=	54
7	×	9	=	63
8	×	9	=	72
9	×	9	=	81
10	×	9	=	90

Take a look at the answers column in **red**– do you notice how it goes up gradually from 1-9? 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 to 9?

Now look at the column in **blue** – do you see how it goes down gradually from 9 to 0?

(Then you only need to remember $9 \times 11 = 99$, which is easy. Double 9. And $9 \times 12 = 108$.)

Isn't the Nine Times Table amazing? ♥
